

How long are the EMT courses?

The courses last approximately 12 to 18 weeks, 24-40 hours per week, depending on the curriculum.

Upon completion of the class, when will I obtain my license?

This class prepares students to sit for the National Registry of Emergency Technicians (NREMT) exam, which provides National EMS Certification for the United States. This offers the EMT much more flexibility and freedom to choose where they will work. Once the student passes the National Registry exam, Superior will help obtain a state license for students in those states where the NREMT certification reciprocity is formally adopted.

What are the fees involved with this class?

Upon receiving their EMT licensure, the student will be hired as a full time employee and be required to complete a one year commitment of continuous full time employment. Superior will also pay for the qualifying student's NREMT exam of two attempts.

Are there any books I need to purchase?

No, Textbooks and workbooks are provided to **each student**.

What kind of schedules can I expect to work as an EMT?

While working in the capacity of a student, your schedule will adhere to the course syllabus until the completion of the EMT program. Upon completion, EMTs must maintain full-time status by working the number of hours per week as stated in the Superior handbook. EMTs are often called upon to fill many different shifts; typically, EMTs at Superior work anywhere between 8 to 12 hours per shift. Shifts can be in the daytime, overnight, or during the weekend.

After obtaining my license, is there anything else I need to do?

EMTs are required to **maintain their** license, also known as CE (Continuing Education). Please see your state and local licensing board for more information on the requirements to keep your license.

What if I need to gain experience working in an ambulance?

Everyone who works in an ambulance started as a student and learned the necessary skills to function independently. You will continue to grow in your career and become more proficient; this is a safe learning environment where everyone will learn and be respectful of one another.

What is the dress code?

After student uniforms have been issued, everyone must wear the company issues uniform shirt, black pants, black leather belt, and black laced work boots.

What is the policy on tattoos and piercings?

Tattoos:

Tattoos must not be offensive; large visible tattoos (tattoos larger than the palm)

Jewelry:

Unobtrusive wristwatches are acceptable; one small ring per hand (wedding set counts as one ring). Necklaces must be kept tucked inside shirts and not visible. Ladies may wear up to two sets of small stud earrings (small studs in the ear lobes **ONLY**, no bars, gauges, hoops, dangling, etc.). Men may not wear earrings of any kind. No visible body piercings are permitted while on duty (eyebrows, nose, tongue, etc.). Prohibited piercings must be removed; covering piercings with a bandage is not allowed.
